Hi Everyone,

Continuing my European trip, I flew from Portugal to the United Kingdom to spend time in the village of Standlake, in the county of Oxfordshire. My first destination there was the village pub, called the Bell Inn. This is where I was born and sadly, and also to the annoyance of the villagers, it's no longer a pub and has been turned into a private residence. A dreadful loss, one of the locals told me!!

I then moved on to meet some friends in Northampton, where I had worked for British Timken, a division of The Timken Company, which is headquartered in Ohio. Northampton has a population of nearly 250,000 people and was most famous for its shoe making industry and Timken Bearings.

After this it was on to the city of Oxford, where I had studied and worked. Oxford, of course, is famous for it's university and the motor industry, being the home of Morris Motors, makers of the "Mini" and of MG sports cars.

By this time I was getting a little tired of the warm beer (not true, just joking) and decided to go to France and get some wine!!

The city of choice was Colmar, in the region of Alsace, in Eastern France, virtually bordering Germany. Colmar is a beautiful example of medieval architecture and was the home of Frederic Bartoldi, the designer of the Statue of Liberty. Its old town has cobblestone streets lined with early Renaissance buildings and with a Gothic 13th-century church of Saint-Martin.

Colmar, is also where Timken France is located and is the site of the Timken Bearing training school, where I first met fellow Gyro, Brian Webb in 1966.

There are still a number of former trainees living in or around the city, so it was the natural place for a reunion. The Company invited us for lunch and a tour of the plant, which was very interesting for us, as there have been many changes since we worked there.

So after much wine and fantastic food in France I boarded the plane to London and then returned to the USA.
