# Subject: Portugal

Hi Everyone, On Sunday evening, and after two flight delays, I finally arrived in Faro, in the Algarve region of Portugal. My daughter and two friends are here with me to celebrate her birthday.

The weather here is similar in temperature to Ohio and is around mid 70s, with blue skies. A little cool for swimming, but perfect for walking and sightseeing. So far we have been to the beach and to the mountains, which are only a short drive away. I have tried two traditional Portuguese meals, the first was fried octopus (not my favorite) and today we went to a winery for wine tasting and tapas. The tapas were excellent, especially the "black pig meat", which is like prosciutto, and goat cheese, which we washed down with 4 different glasses of local wine!! The guide at the winery also played guitar and sang and asked if anyone would like to sing, so of course after 4 glasses I had to give a chorus of "Sweet Caroline"!!

So, since we are giving travel updates here's mine.

Leslie, my son Bob, and I arrived in Barcelona yesterday. The weather is great, low 70's and sunny. We went to a restaurant our first night here and also enjoyed octopus (Leslie passed) as well as 4 other tapas dishes including a Spanish bruschetta, crispy sardines, lamb tacos, and ox tail sandwich. Today we will go to the Picasso museum. The following day we visit the Gaudi designed Sagrada Familia Basilica where construction began 130 years ago and is scheduled for completion in 2026!


I will be flying to Ft Myers on June 15 to oversee the installation of a new dock since mine was damaged by hurricane Ian.

# DISTRICT X GOVERNORS REPORT AGM, NIAGARA FALLS, JUNE, 2024

"It is not what we have in life, but who we have in our life that matters"

Greetings from Gyro District X. We are alive with one strong club and offer heartfelt wishes that our Fraternity of Friendship and its' members enjoy the proximity of interclub events with other clubs in their Districts.

District X has seen 6 of its 7 clubs resign their Charters in the last 5 years. The same malady that strikes a disheartening number of clubs throughout Gyro also infected previously good clubs here in Florida. Death took four members of the Gasparilla club, 3 of whom were past Governors, and International Presidents.

Sarasota spark plug President and Past Governor fell ill and was unable to keep the fun alive for his members who wished not to serve in his place. Ft Lauderdale members, after recycling 2 of its repeat Presidents several times, fell exhausted and were disinterested in continuing to support any activity that involved District or Int'l events.

It is a repeat story that foretells a challenging future for our Fraternity of Friendship. It does not, however, describe finality. Rather, it illuminates the accepted proposition that "membership retention" is the critical component that supports "Keeping the Fun in Gyro." It also spotlights positive/active club membership recruiting programs.

External expansion in our past history provided new clubs being formed in the decades following WWI, WWII and Korea. 30+ new clubs were chartered in each of those "Post War Recovery Periods." Troops returning from harms-way understood the value of friendship and were eager to connect. The U.S has been involved in 15 "shadow wars," and some directly since 2001. Would returning Vets today be any less motivated for shared friendship? Let's announce Gyro to them!

District 10 intends to rebuild with the addition of new friendship clubs by targeting retirement communities, new modern cities that have been developed, special- interest groups composed of Baby Boomers as members of associations of retired Teachers, Lawyers, Physicians, Military, Police, Fire Fighters, Accountants, Financial planners, and Realtors.

# Plans for rebuilding District X have been drafted on four platforms:

- 1. Growing the Caloosa Club (currently 31 members) so that two smaller clubs may be formed by bedding the members geographically into the N Fort Myers and Cape Coral Clubs.
- 2. Babcock Ranch is a newly developed, self-sustaining, solar powered, "Green City" with over 300 homes and more being built. They have their own School, Security, Citizens Committee, Grocery Stores and Shops, etc. A Gyro Club introduction is scheduled for August 2024 with the Rotary Club. All Rotary members are residents of Babcock Ranch. The presentation is provided with 5 minutes for the introduction, then 1 hour networking the assembled tables. Packets, similar to the New Members Kits will be available.

The goal is to either recruit into the two existing clubs mentioned above, or motivate the formation of a Babcock Ranch Club, bringing D-X to 3 clubs. Then repeat in other locations.

3. Reach out to the Retired Professional Associations described above by inviting them as speakers to our Gyro events. Or instead, request the opportunity of being invited as a Gyro Speaker during one of their meetings.

Part B of scheduling speakers, can be used to attract non-Gyro groups to attend. Example:

We have scheduled a couple's luncheon for November 13<sup>th</sup> with a speaker from Lee County Port Authority (Ft Myers Int'l Airport). The venue is the club house private dining room of Herons Glen, a 1,300 home, Golf-retirement community. A notice of the scheduled Gyro event will be broadcast through the residents' news-letter announcing additional limited space available for those interested. We currently have 13 club members who are HG residents.

4. Health Care Retirement Villages will be contacted to introduce "Independent Living Residents' to our Fraternity of Friendship, and to the benefits that social contact offers for improved mental and emotional recovery, and longer life to those who feel isolated. It is a real value proposition! We have identified 5 such facilities around Tampa, 5 around Ft Lauderdale, and 5 here in SW Florida. This ignored demographic displays thousands of facilities in the U.S. and hundreds more in Canada. Corporate Management of multiple locations, of these types of facilities would be eager to learn of a "no cost" friendship organization that provides quality of life enhancement to its residents. "Win-Win!"

# **SUMMARY:**

District X is in the search for members who wish to be considered for serving on the D-X EC, all positions. Realizing that D-X has a greatly reduced roster, and that Int'l is holding one convention per year may salve the concerns of candidates that serving the District will not be burdensome or interfere with leisure time.

The Caloosa Club continues to recruit senior citizens, (mature candidates) that bring their "savvy and energetic assets" to strengthen the club. They are stepping up to fill officer positions, and help staff our 3 committees for Event Planning, Communications, and Member Recruiting. Their Gyrettes are also recruiting successfully, and serving on the events committee. "Win-Win!"
