INTERNATIONAL NEWS:

Here is the body of an email from Derek Hay, Gyroscope Editor and President of the Winnipeg Gyro Club:

Subject: 2023 Convention & AGM - Hosted by Winnipeg

Just some of the known facts about Winnipeg:

Winnipegger Charles Thorson, who began his career as an illustrator for the department store Eaton's, spent most of his spare time at a local café flirting with a young waitress named Kristen. In 1935 Charlie left for Los Angeles where his talent for character design landed him positions at Disney Studios and Warner Bros. At Disney, his inspiration for Snow White was based on Kristen, the cafe Waitress and then at WB he created Elmer Fudd and designed and named Bugs Bunny.

In 1941, a World War 1 captain from Winnipeg, Harry Colebourn, took a black bear cub to England as his regiment's mascot. When Colebourn shipped out to France he donated the bear, named Winnie as his hometown, to the London Zoo. Author A.A. Milne and his son Christopher Robin loved "Winnie the Bear" and Milne crafted the much-adored stories about his boy and the bear that we still enjoy today, known as Winnie the Pooh.

Our cultural diversity leads to over 100 languages being spoken in Winnipeg.

Message from the Membership Chairman, Steve Anderson

GYRO PRINCIPLE

The Gyroscope principle is controlled power, poise, and balance. From this principle come the key Gyro words:

HOW SOCIAL CONNECTION SAVES LIVES

"Higher levels of social interaction –even peripheral interactions – can have a high payoff for elderly folks", says Bryan James, an Epidemiologist at the Rush Alzheimer's Center in Chicago. In one study, James looked how social activity affected cognitive decline. Over 1,100 seniors without dementia at base-line were measured on their social activity levels over a 12 year period. The rate of cognitive decline was 70% less in people with frequent social contact than those with low social activity. Physical and emotional condition was also greatly improved, creating an elevated sense of happiness.

"When you use your brain and body the way it was intended - as it evolved - you age better," says James. "We aren't meant to be disengaged from one another."
